Shortly about the webinar

The webinar was opened by the Head of the City Planning Department Chemnitz, **Börries Butenop**. Afterwards, **Frank Feuerbach** (City of Chemnitz) and **Martin Neubert** (Housing Agency) briefly described the network and the agency. **Nils Scheffler**, lead expert of the ALT/BAU network, then introduced the topics. In the course of the webinar, he presented the basic tasks and goals for each individual topic.

In the five thematic complexes, our ALT/BAU partners from Seraing, Riga, Constanta, Turin and Vilafranca reported on their approaches and creative solutions. The Lead Partner Chemnitz also reported on its experiences.

Thanks to the airmeet platform, it was possible to move freely among the online participants between the individual thematic blocks and "take a seat at various tables" to exchange ideas or also to ask questions of the speakers.

Céline Ethuin, URBACT secretariat, gave an outlook on the future of URBACT and **Ivan Tosics**, URBACT Programme expert, looked at the ALT/BAU network in terms of how the EU renovation wave can be used financially and energetically to support the reactivation of vacant buildings and how the reactivation of vacant buildings can be used to address affordability issues with socially motivated actors.

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What is the webinar about?

Numerous cities in Europa have vacant historical buildings in their city centre and surrounding urban quarters in need of refurbishment. The buildings are often significant for the identity and history of the city, they are worth preserving and bringing back into use! Maybe you are experiencing the same in your city. But how can your municipality tackle the issue? How to change those complicated ownership structures? How to connect to the owners? How to find potential buyers and new investors? How to integrate alternative approaches for social housing or temporary use?

After two years of intensive exchange between seven European cities, the URBACT ALT/BAU Transfer Network has developed field-proven answers to those questions based on an URBACT Good Practice from Chemnitz, Germany. Seraing (BE), Vilafranca del Penedès (ES), Turin (IT), Riga (LV), Rybnik (PL) and Constanța (RO) want to share their results and approach of launching Building Activation Units in their municipalities with interested cities and urban practitioners. They share their methods and recommend-dations from cities to cities, from urban practitioners to urban practitioners.
